Pawtuckaway State Park Camping Information

About the Campground

The campground is open from mid-May to the end of October. Reservations can be made from Memorial Day weekend through Columbus Day weekend.

About the Policies

- Check-in is after 1 pm. Registered campers may leave during closed hours by the 24 hour access road adjacent to the park entrance.
- Payment due upon registration may be made by cash, voucher, money order, Mastercard, Visa, or Discover.
- There is a maximum of two vehicles per site, including those of paid guests.
- Camping equipment must be set up on the designated dirt portion of campsites, adjacent to the picnic table and fireplace.
- Maximum per site: one trailer (tent or travel) and one tent; or one motor home and one tent; or 2 large tents.
- Pets are not permitted in the campground or park.
- Day guests of registered campers must pay the day-use fee at the toll booth and may visit in the campground during posted visitor hours (7am to 10pm).
- Overnight guests of registered campers must register at campground office and pay overnight fee.
- Alcohol is not permitted in the day-use area
- Quiet hours are from 10 pm to 7 am.
- Campers are responsible for bringing their trash and recyclables to the dump area.
- Help protect the campground trees. Do not drive nails into trees, hang gas lanterns on trees, cut any standing trees, or remove their limbs.
- Check-out time is 11 am. After check-out, campers may park and spend the remainder of the day in the day-use area. Parties with a trailer may park in the beach parking lot.
- RVs are not permitted in youth group areas.
- Firewood is a major carrier of exotic insects and tree diseases. Please do not bring firewood from out-of-state locations.

Activities

Enjoy hiking, biking, fishing, boating and swimming.

Facilities, Services and Amenities

Each campsite has an open fireplace, picnic table, flat area for a tent, and a parking space. Running water, flush toilets, a camp store, boat launch, and canoe and kayak rentals are available. Coin-operated showers are accessible 24 hours a day.

For Your Safety

Do not invite raccoons, ducks or other wildlife to the beach or into the campground. Keep the park clean by disposing of food waste properly and securing all food items in your vehicle at night. Coolers left out are easily opened by hungry raccoons. Feeding the geese attracts large numbers to the swimming area where they become a health concern.
